This magnificent home, with its unique blend of medieval and 17th-century architecture, holds many years of memories and is ready to welcome a new family to make memories of their own.



COME ON IN...



Stone steps rise up, passing flowerbeds where the bright red blooms of peonies greet you. The hallway extends before you, giving access to the rooms on either side. Your eye is drawn to the feature fireplace at the head of the corridor. Off the hallway is a WC with twin marble hand basins.



GRAND LIVING SPACES...

The living room is at the front of the home and has an impressive fireplace, which is perfect for a roaring open fire on a chilly evening.















WINE & DINE...

The dining room is a show-stopping space. Impressive oak panelling covers the walls and there is intricate plasterwork on the ceiling and frieze. The fireplace is large and imposing, a mark of the importance of this home. This is a wonderful room with a rich history and sense of grandeur, perfect for hosting glamorous dinner parties or lavish Christmas gatherings.

THE HEART OF THE HOME...



The kitchen is a functional and social space where meals are prepared and enjoyed by the family. The Aga keeps the whole room warm and is excellent for cooking. A farmhouse table sits in the centre and can tell of many years of breakfasts, lunches and dinners of the many families that have loved and lived in this magnificent home.

The utility room houses many modern conveniences and appliances, with space for a washing machine, dishwasher and fridge freezer. There is also a traditional walk-in pantry to store food and dry goods, ensuring that the property is not only steeped in history but also equipped for modern living.

There is also a vaulted cellar below that provides storage with a decent head height.









CHARMING BEDROOMS...

Oak-panelled walls extend up the turned staircase, where light pours in through the picture window. Here, you will find access to the five bedrooms, each with its own unique character and charm, and ample space for a comfortable living experience.

The first bedroom on the left has a marvellous vaulted ceiling with exposed roof timbers. The bed is positioned perfectly for a view out of the window.

REST & REFRESH...

There are three further bedrooms, each a very good size, with exposed beams and roof trusses. One of the bedrooms has an ensuite bathroom with bath, shower, wash basin, bidet and WC. Finally, on the first floor is a room currently used as a study but could also be perfectly serviceable as a fifth bedroom.









GLORIOUS GARDENS...




Gates lead to a large gravelled parking area, with steps leading up to the front door. The terrace to the side is private and gets the best of the evening sun. There is even a perfect spot to sit and rest your wine glass as the sun sets. At the left-hand side of the property is a Victorian well, covered but entirely usable and with a pump to manage the water level.

The gardens to the side of the home are enclosed and shielded by trees, including a 450-year-old Yew tree, the namesake from when Headlands Hall was a coaching inn in the 18th century. Immaculate striped lawns stretch out, edged by a gravel footpath and flowerbeds with shrubs and bushes. There is also a traditional Finnish BBQ hut with a central chimney and firepit for the most amazing garden parties and BBQs with family and friends.
